

RE: GUIDANCE FOR UNIVERSAL MASKING IN THE HEALTHCARE SETTING

To reduce COVID-19 transmission to patients, employees, family members, and the community by requiring all UMC Employees, Volunteers and Contractors ("Staff") at this Facility to wear facemasks during the time the DC Health Directive Policy in accordance with the Mayor's Order 2020-063 recommendations related to universal masking is in effect.

The hospital requires all Staff to properly wear a facemask while in the health care facility. Facility is the main hospital, the medical office building and alternative setting where patient care services are provided (i.e. the outdoor PODS).


For Facility employees, medical staff members, facemasks shall be provided free of charge at your assigned work area. Contractors and Volunteers are required to provide their own facemask.

The Chief Medical Officer will provide written notification when this policy is no longer effective.


Transportation

Program Details:

- Each week employees can access the Uber promo code via the following link: https://r.uber.com/cdTeela5IW
- Once downloaded employees can use their Uber account as they normally would, and the credits will automatically apply
- Rides are valid from 9 pm 1 am every day and 5 am 8 am on weekends
- Trips must begin or end at UMC hospital entrance
- Each trip is valid for up to \$25; balance owed by each passenger
- Health care workers are required to show their hospital badge and wear a face mask when ride sharing


