RE: Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine Education and Staff Appointment Schedule

As part of our commitment to provide health care workers with a safe working environment during the COVID-19 pandemic, ***UMC is proud to offer the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to its Employees and Medical staff.*** At this time, the vaccine is available to front-line medical personnel on a voluntary and no-cost basis. In order to ensure that we obtain and distribute enough vaccines for our entire staff **we need assistance from every department manager.**

The vaccine will be administered on the 6th floor nursing unit **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY.**

Due the number of vaccines currently available, everyone cannot be vaccinated at the same time. In order to ensure distribution of the educational materials and fairly administer vaccines, **MANAGERS WILL BE REQUIRED** to distribute and collect information and schedule vaccination appointments for their team.

To ensure safety and effectiveness, UMC along with DC Health will monitor the administration of the vaccine in accordance with Phase 1a of the District's vaccination plan. All employees and medical staff members are encouraged to receive the vaccine. **To ensure all staff are informed and offered the opportunity to receive the vaccine managers shall:**

1. Distribute the attached educational materials during each shift team meeting.
2. Schedule **two appointments** for staff interested in receiving the vaccine. **Call Patient Access at 202-574-6473 to schedule appointments.**

The vaccination is 94.5% effective at decreasing the chance of getting the COVID-19 disease when administered properly. ***Proper administration = TWO DOSES administered a few weeks apart for proper administration.***

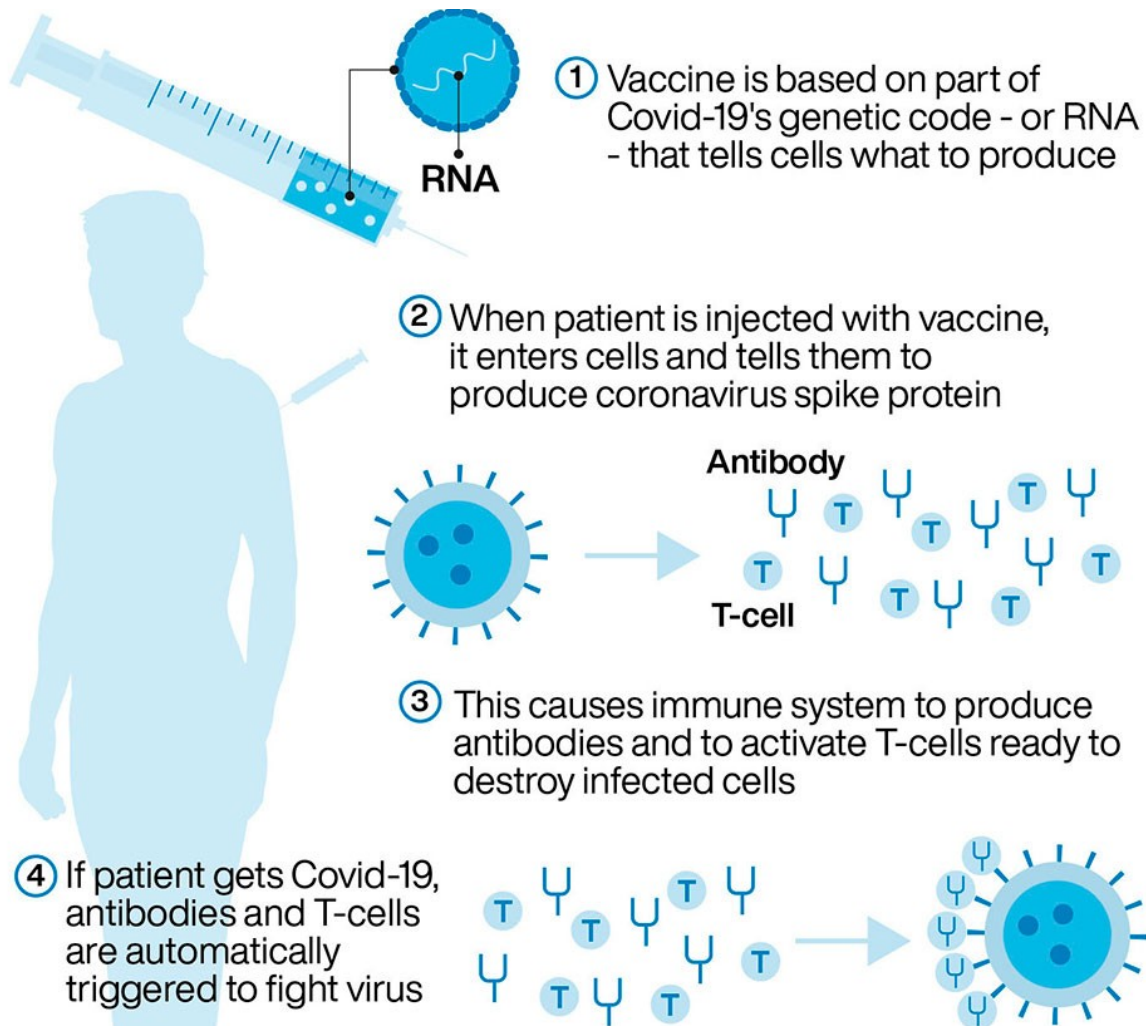
HOW EFFECTIVE IS THE VACCINE?

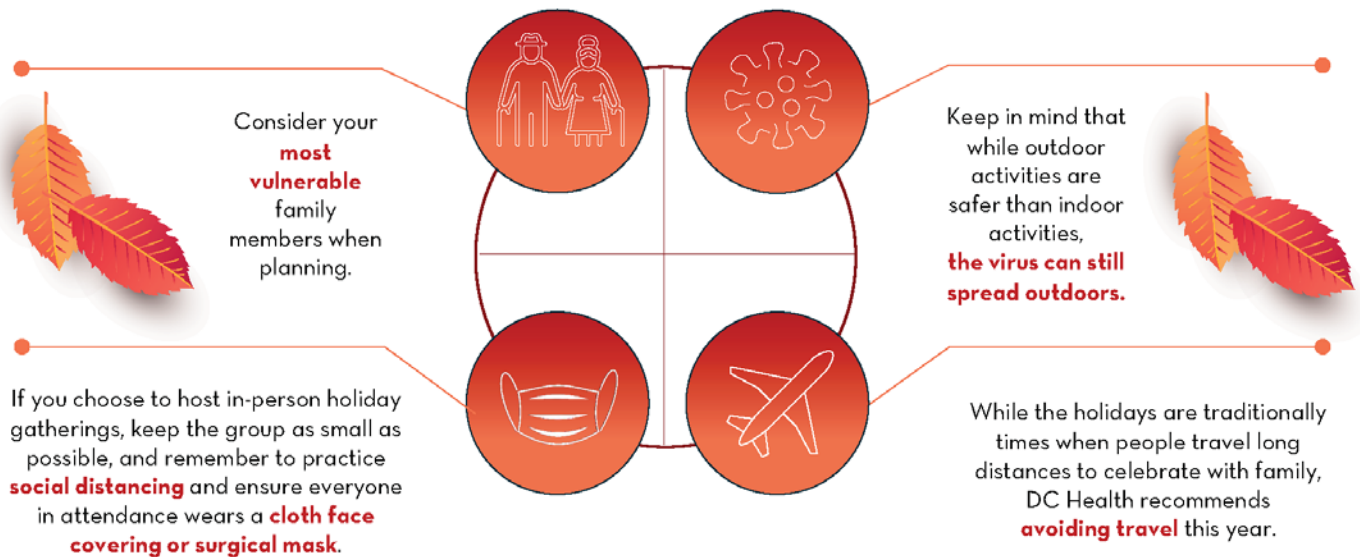

Host Considerations
